## **Regulations for the virtual EGMO**

B.1. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, EGMO 2020 will be a purely virtual event. Any regulations referring to activities happening physically in the Netherlands, are not applicable.

B.2. There will be online activities from 15 to 21 April 2020. Details about those activities will be communicated by email, social media and/or the EGMO 2020 app.

B.3. Contestants will sit the contest in the country they currently reside in, at a location determined by their Leader. This may be a different location for each contestant, if the rules in their country make this necessary.

B.4. Contestants will sit both papers of the contest somewhere between 16 April 02:00 UTC and 18 April 22:00 UTC. For each country, all Contestants representing that country will sit the contest at the exact same time. Each paper of the contest lasts four and a half hours. Each Contestant must work independently.

B.5. Contestants, Leaders and Deputy Leaders will do their utmost to ensure that the contest problems are kept confidential until 18 April 22:00 UTC.

B.6. There will be no virtual version of the Jury meetings. Any decisions that should be taken by the Jury (such as approval of problems, approval of translations, approval of marking schemes, approval of medal boundaries) are done by the Jury Chair on behalf of the Jury.

B.7. Contestants are allowed to ask written questions in the first half hour of the contest. Questions do not need to be considered by the Jury. The Leader may answer the questions instead.

B.8. Matters about future EGMOs are handled by the Advisory Board on behalf of the Jury.

B.9. There will be no virtual version of Coordination. Leaders and Deputy Leaders will do their utmost to award fair and consistent scores to their Contestants, using the marking schemes provided. Leaders and Deputy Leaders may consult a group of Coordinators for advice if they wish.
